

4-H EXHIBITS & SHOWS

Department H

Check Master Schedule for Dates and Times

Rules

1. Only regularly enrolled or officially transferred Fremont County 4-H members are eligible to exhibit in this department. If you are not a 4-H member, you enter in the Open Class section of this catalog.
2. Exhibits must be part of the current project year.
3. **HOW TO ENTER THE FAIR – ENTRY FORM SEE MASTER SCHEDULE FOR HELP DAY – PLEASE ATTEND! YOU WILL BE ABLE TO GET YOUR ID CARDS FOR FAIR AT THIS TIME AND TURN IN YOUR ENTRY FORMS. WE WILL BE OPEN FROM FOR HELP IN FILLING OUT FORMS AND ANSWERING ANY QUESTIONS YOU HAVE ABOUT FAIR.**
 - A. Pick up a premium catalog and entry blank from a 4-H Club Community Leader (ONE CATALOG PER FAMILY).
 - B. Use one entry blank per exhibitor. If you have more exhibits than spaces to enter them on your entry blank, use a second entry blank and staple them together before turning them in. Do not use the back of the entry blank or notebook paper. Only items entered on the front of an entry form will be entered into the Fair.
 - C. When filling out your entry blank, use care. Your age is determined as of January 1st of the current year. Use this age to determine what class you enter. If you have other questions, please ask before filling out your entry blank. Mark in your premium catalog the Classes you are going to enter. Fill in the entry blank and have your club leader check it.
 - D. If two or more entries are allowed in any one Class, be sure to write that Class Code and description on your entry blank as many times as you have entries.
 - E. **HAVE YOUR PARENT SIGN THE ENTRY BLANK.**
Entry Blanks that are not signed will not be accepted.
4. **GETTING YOUR EXHIBITS TO FAIR**
 - A. Pick your entry tags up from the Fair Office (check master schedule for pickup time). You should have one tag per item entered. Be sure your claim tickets are with your entry tags as you will have to have a claim ticket to claim your entry after the fair.
 - B. **Attach your tag(s) to your item(s) before you bring your entry to Fair.** When possible attach the tag to the upper left corner. *Please read rules for each division for any specific entry information. PLEASE DO NOT PUNCH, STAPLE OR DAMAGE THE BAR CODE IN ANY WAY.*
 - C. **Pictures, posters, and display boards** must have a hole punched in the top for hanging.
5. **WHEN AND WHERE EXHIBITS ARE DUE AT FAIR**
Refer to **MASTER SCHEDULE** for all arrival times and locations.
6. **INTERVIEW JUDGING**
This is an opportunity for the exhibitor to sit down with the judge while the judge evaluates their exhibits. This is a positive learning experience for the exhibitor and parents are encouraged to accompany exhibitors. If the exhibitor is unable to attend, their exhibits will be judged and written comments will be given.
7. **STATE FAIR EXHIBITS**
Release forms - Any items qualifying for state fair will require a release form. You must sign a release form. If you are not provided a release form at the judging table, stop by the Extension Secretary table before you leave interview judging and sign a release form.
Transportation of State Fair qualifying items – Please consult the Extension Office to verify how or if your item will be transported to State Fair. Some items are too large or fragile to transport with all other entries. If this is the case, you will be responsible for arranging to transport your own qualifying exhibit to State Fair. Be sure to check with the Extension Office about your qualified exhibit. It is your responsibility to double check on whether your item has been transported. All efforts will be made to transport as many items as possible, but check on your item before you leave Fair and be sure it is being transported or arrange other options with the Extension Office.
Ribbons & Trophies – It is your responsibility to remove your ribbons from exhibits traveling to State Fair on Sunday prior to your item being taken to State Fair if you wish to retain it. No ribbons will be left attached to any item traveling to state fair. If you are to receive a trophy or award for your entry, a claim card and thank you note will be attached to your item. This claim card is to be turned in to the Fair Office and you must sign for your trophy or award. Please do so anytime during fair until Sunday exhibit release day until noon. **Do not remove your entry tag! This is the only means of identifying your exhibit.**
8. **RETRIEVING YOUR EXHIBITS**
Any items not qualifying for State Fair may be picked up on Sunday, release day from 7:00 am – 12:00 noon. Bring your claim tickets to the 4-H display area and turn them in to the superintendent. Please pick up all of your

items at this time. Any items not picked up will be disposed of.

State Fair items – (please read Rule #7 for transportation details). Items returning from State Fair may be picked up from the Extension Office starting on August 20th from

8:00 am – 12:00 noon and 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm.

9. Please review all General Rules for Fair and consult Junior Livestock Rules if you have animal exhibits.

4-H SHOWS

CAT SHOW – DIVISION 14

Superintendent – Toni Deckert

All rules and expectations for WSF and other Junior and 4-H Show animal exhibitors will be applicable to the 4-H Cat Show.

Rules

1. The Household Pet cat is a mixed breed of unknown descent.
2. A Purebred cat is one belonging to a recognized breed with characteristics maintained through generations of unmixed descent; may be registered with a recognized registry.
3. Kittens must be at least four months old and not older than eight months of age. Adult cats are older than eight months of age. Because of susceptibility to disease, no kitten under four months of age will be accepted for competition.
4. No pregnant or nursing cats may be entered.
5. All cats and kittens must have their claws clipped. Declawed cats may enter the show and will not be counted down for declawing.
6. Do not enter your cat if you feel it will not be easily handled by the judge.
7. Each cat or kitten must be wearing a harness or collar (not a safety collar) and a leash. The exhibitor must always wear the leash on their wrist for safety reasons.
8. Exhibitors must furnish their own carpet square during judging. Exhibitors must provide a proper cage or carrier for their cats/kittens. Exhibitors must bring their own litter and litter box.
9. All exhibitors should wear long sleeve shirts or blouses with trousers or skirts. **No shorts allowed.**

Health Requirements

Cats must have current rabies and distemper shots. It is strongly suggested, but not mandatory, that all entries have the combination vaccinations, plus feline leukemia. Vaccinations should be received within three weeks prior to the show. Health Certificates are required.

Cats found to be ill or with parasites (fleas, ear mites, etc.) will not be allowed to show and will be dismissed from the grounds.

No cat or kitten may enter the show if there is any (feline) infectious or contagious disease in the household within three weeks prior to the show date.

4-H DOG SHOW – DIVISION 15

Superintendent – Christina Colva

Rules

1. 4-H members qualify to enter the State 4-H Dog Show by showing in their county 4-H dog show AND:
Showmanship - youth won showmanship at county fair or the county 4-H Educator designated the youth - Champion Junior, Intermediate or Senior.
Obedience - received a qualifying score of (170) or above.
Confirmation - youth won champion or reserve champion at county fair.
2. Age classification are: junior (age 8-10), intermediate (age 11-13) and senior (Age 14-18), all 4-H members ages are determined as of January 1 of the Year of the show.
3. 4-H members entering the dog project may use co-owned dogs (owned by the immediate family). The member must have sole care, training and showing of that dog for the current 4-H year and have a training contract. Leased dogs are only allowed at the State level, with a training contract.

Ownership: The dog lives in the same residence with the 4-H member and is owned by the 4-H youth or immediate family member (grandparents, mother, father, brother, sister).

Co-Ownership: Ownership ID Sheets extend beyond the family with two or more names on the papers to prove co-ownership exists. One of the names on the ID Sheet must be the 4-H youth or an immediate family member.

Dog Training Contract: The 4-H member may enter into an agreement to train someone else's dog in situations that may benefit the member, the dog or both. This arrangement is used for families with the inability to own a dog. **The training contract should not be used as a substitute for normal dog ownership.**

The Co-ownership Agreement, Training Contract and dog ID Sheets **all must be completed and submitted to the State 4-H office before May 1 of the current 4-H year.**

4. All animal entries of bonafide Wyoming origin must be accompanied by an official Health Certificate issued at the point of origin by an accredited veterinarian. Certificates for dog entries must show current immunization as per State veterinary guidelines. **No animals will be allowed to exhibit at the Wyoming State Fair without a valid Animal Health Certificate.**
5. **All dogs must be on a leash (excluding competition) and under control at all times. State Fair rules prohibit any dog from being any place but the campground and the site of the dog show.** Dogs must not be taken near the stock barns. Once the 4-H dog show is completed, all dogs must be removed from the fairgrounds.
6. Vicious dogs will be dismissed from the ring and must be removed from the premises.
7. Females in season will be allowed in classes. However, they will go through at the end of all classes.
8. Spayed, monorchid and neutered dogs may be shown without judging discrimination.
9. Dogs must be clean and well groomed.
10. The show committee reserves the right to ask anyone violating these rules to leave.
11. Judging of classes will be done with AKC rules as guidelines; however, specific Wyoming 4-H Dog Show Rules (Rule number 1, 2, 3, and 4) will supersede AKC rules.
12. High in trial will be calculated on the basis of the raw score plus five additional points with each increase in level of difficulty.
13. No class will be held up for a contestant in a different Fair Show.

OBEDIENCE

Rules

1. A 4-H member may compete in only one obedience class per dog.
2. No dog can compete in any one class more than two years in a row. Members advance from On Leash A to Novice A or from On Leash B to Novice B. On Leash B is for the dog or exhibitor with previous experience in the Class. An exhibitor who begins in the A group with a dog stays in the A group for each Class. The same is true for the B group.
4. 4-H members with an obedience dog shown previously by another 4-H handler or AKC

Obedience Title must show the dog by these guidelines.

- a. Junior 4-H'ers may move back or down one level.
- b. Senior 4-H'ers must show the dog at the highest level.
5. Males and females will be shown in the same Class. Females in heat will be shown last and must be kept away from the obedience ring until call time.
6. A dog having a qualifying score of 170 points at the County show must advance to the next higher level the following year.
7. Score Sheets: The Wyoming 4-H dog score sheets were designed for the benefit of 4-H members. They are intended as guides for judges. Judges use their discretion in deciding the seriousness of errors.
8. An exhibitor must show their dog with a six-foot leash.
9. Dogs soiling in the ring will be disqualified.

CONFORMATION

Rules

1. Classes will be subdivided by breeds within a Class, if numbers warrant. First place winners in Classes 12-21 will compete for the Best in Show trophy in conformation.
2. Exhibitors entering more than one dog in any Class may be assisted only by another 4-H member (from the same county, if possible), if the dogs must be shown at the same time.
3. Classes 12-19 will be judged according to AKC standards, but it is not necessary that dogs be registered; they must be purebred - both animal parents of the same breed.
4. Classes 20 and 21 will be judged according to the predominant breed characteristics.

5. Please see your 4-H educator for the list of breeds that are eligible for each group before entering your dog.

AGILITY

***In order to compete at the State fair in dog Agility, you must have participated in a obedience and/or a conformation class in the current year as well as the Fremont County Dog Agility Dog Contest**

Rules

- All competitors will start at level one. Advancements are allowed after one qualifying score to the next level. After three qualifying scores in Level One, Two and Three, advancement to the next level is mandatory. Same day advancement is not allowed from one level to another level.
- An entry in the State 4-H Agility Contest must have competed in a County agility contest to qualify. To enter in Agility you must also have participated in another 4-H dog exhibit (Obedience and/or Confirmation) during the current 4-H year at your County Fair. A qualifying score is not required in obedience classes, only participation at County Fair.
- 4-H members are not allowed to pass a level at the State show and compete in the next highest. They must compete in the level they qualified for at county fair.

- Youth can enter a single dog in only one Rally Class.
 - "A" Classes are for dogs that have not had a qualifying Obedience or Rally score in AKC competitions or that do not have an Obedience or Rally Title in AKC competitions.
 - "B" Classes are for dogs that have had a qualifying Obedience or Rally score in AKC competitions or that do have an Obedience or Rally Title in AKC competitions.
- Dogs soiling in the ring will be disqualified.
- All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash. Those competing in On Leash Classes should do so with a 6-foot leash.
- Collars may be flat buckle (leather or nylon) or choke chains.
- No bait (dog treats) is allowed in the ring.

4-H CAKE DECORATING - DIVISION 19

Rules

1. All exhibits should attach skills summary questions or may be penalized at judge's discretion.
2. Open only to members enrolled in the cake decorating project.
3. Decorating must be done on an artificial cake form, such as Styrofoam or inverted cake pan. Do not exhibit on real cakes.
4. Exhibits should be placed on disposable plates or boards covered with foil, plastic or decorative covering, and allow 1" minimum of free space between cake and outer edge of plate or board.
5. Do not bring exhibits on glass plates or valued trays. The State Fair is not responsible for breakage.
6. Frosting should make a good base for the decorations.
7. Design should be suitable for the size and shape of cake. It should show good use of color and a pleasing combination of decorations.

8. Member must exhibit only in class of unit in which they are enrolled. See members' manual for details on exhibit requirement.
9. Posters should be limited to a maximum of 22" x 28". Put a small hole in upper center of poster for hanging. Display boards should not exceed 2' x 3'.
10. All exhibits with frosting that are not picked up by release of exhibits may be disposed of by 4-H management. Ribbons will be saved and given to respective counties.

- Canned goods must be exhibited in regulation canning jars (half-pint, pint or quart). All jelly products (jellies, jams, conserves, marmalades, butters) must be processed in a boiling water bath to be judged. Paraffin sealed jars will not be judged. Jelly products can be exhibited in one-half (1/2) cup regulation jars. For instructions, check with your Extension office or the UW CES Nutrition Website: <http://www.uwyo.edu/cesnutrition> click on UW Food & Nutrition Publications.
- For food safety reasons, meat jerky entries must be prepared using methods recommended by the University of Wyoming Cooperative Extension Service, and the recipe must accompany the product. To obtain the recommended recipes, contact your Extension Office or go to the UWCES Food and Nutrition website at www.uwyo.edu/cesnutrition and click on "UW Food and Nutrition Publications." Ground jerky products **will be disqualified** because they cannot be processed in the home.

CONSTRUCTION

1. Senior Fashion Revue Contestants are based on the number of senior Fashion & Fabric members currently enrolled in counties. In addition, each County may send one junior (8-13 years old).
2. Garments may be from reused fabric, and may be all or partially hand knitted or crocheted.
3. Members entering the Fashion Revue will submit an entrant application and a narration sheet. Exhibit tags are not necessary, but all garments should be labeled with name and address.
4. Fashion Revue contestants will be judged by adult judges on the following scoring system: the member, style and fabric selection, outside pressing, construction detail and fit. Judges may ask members questions about their garments.
5. Fashion Revue garments may be construction judged. Garments must be entered by 5:00 p.m. on Monday and may be picked up after 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday. See clothing section for appropriate Class numbers. Construction judging is optional and will in no way influence the Fashion Revue placing. All Fashion Revue contestants wishing to have their garments construction judged must have received a County purple to enter.
6. It is up to the youth to be responsible for checking clothes in/out for modeling.

BUYMANSHIP

1. Each County is able to enter one junior (ages 8-13 years) and one senior (ages 14+ years). Additional slots are available based on senior Fashion and Fabric project enrollments of counties.
2. Members entering will submit an entrant application and a narration sheet. No exhibit tag is necessary but all garments should be labeled with name and address.
3. Members who enter in the Buymanship Division of the Fashion Revue may have another person make the garment that is worn.
4. Contestants will be interviewed.
5. The packets should contain information about what the youth learned in their project (i.e., comparison of price and quality, as well as decisions on how the chosen garment is appropriate for age, body shape, and coloring).
6. Overall scoring of contestants is based on: 20% modeling, 40% interview, and 40% written report.
